We will fire your work in the kiln during the week and students will return the following Saturday to work on de-moulding and finishing their glass. We ask that you come with an idea. You may for example arrive with a silicone mould that you would like to pour wax into or a texture that you would like to take an imprint from and translate into glass in an open mould form. We will walk you through casting in 3D using a lost wax casting method or using clay or wax to create an open cast mould. You will learn how to work quickly and to test your ideas with valuable input from Max's extensive experience in mould making and glass casting.

The cost for this course is £290.

Due to the nature in the variation of mould size per student, your materials will be charged separate to the course fee. (Expected cost will be £15-30 for mould materials and £20 – 50 for glass).

The world around us is constantly moving but how do we show this in our glasswork? By capturing the energy and pull of gravity on warm glass in the kiln, it is possible to imbue both fused and cast objects with spontaneous, natural movement.
