LECTURES AND DEMONSTRATIONS

- 2008 – present The Materialism lecture series defines an art movement of contemporary artists of the 1950s and 60s who gained a mastery of materials traditionally employed by artisans using clay, glass, wood and metal. Research is based on interviews and video recordings of artists in their studios. The series is in collaboration with Professor Joseph Rapone of the University of the Arts in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.
- 1974 – present Mr. Dailey gives lectures and demonstrations around the world and in the United States at numerous public and private organizations including museums, schools and industry.
